### Summary **Statement**

Since post covid times, we've seen continuous growth in membership for the athletics club and a strong array of success individually and for the club.

As with the previous year (2022) our key growth areas are with the younger juniors and the seniors, whilst maintaining a core with our intermediates.

The Seniors are indeed going from strength to strength and include great success at the Brighton 10km for Jack Kavanagh, team success for the men's & woman's teams culminating in the Senior men winning promotion to Surrey Cross Country League division 2 and representation in the London Marathon.

The juniors & U20s continue their success in Track & Field; selections for country level, competing at England Nationals, medals at Surrey County championships and having high ranking athletes at national level. For a small club we certainly punch above our weight (metaphorically speaking, not physically).


Going forwards, as a club with many junior members, we continuously must spend significant time focusing on the welfare & safeguarding of our athletes & coaches, making sure we stay aligned to the latest guidelines from the government, UK Athletics & England athletics. We also have the challenge of resources available vs club ambitions. We constantly have a challenge of coaching and officials' shortage, coupled with a slow trend of older junior athletes looking elsewhere to train & compete for, so if anyone is keen to be a coach, just step forwards.

- > One Club, One Purpose, One Voice taking longer to achieve


### Membership **Numbers**

- Safeguarding


3045 training session attendances (sign-ins) of which:





#### Membership subscriptions






